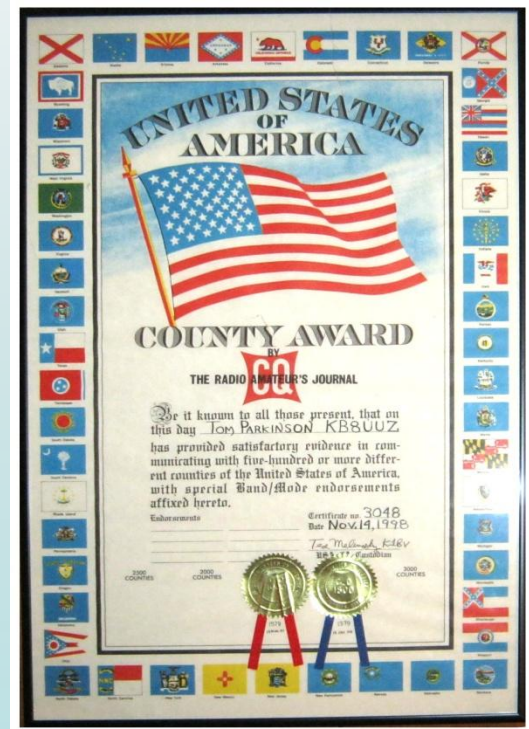
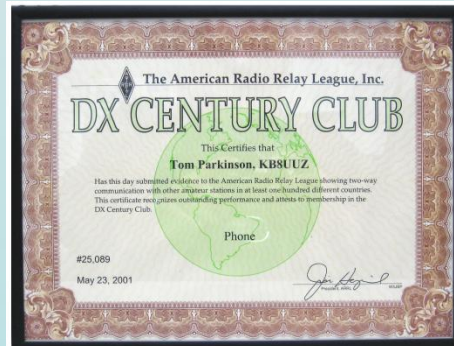
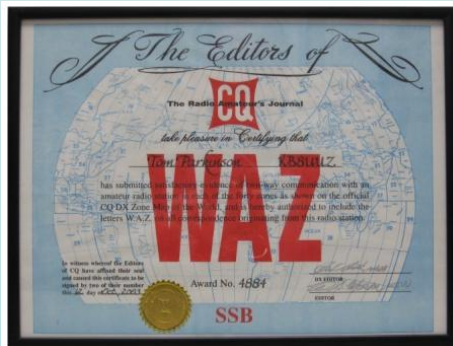
Why QSL cards?

Awards. Most awards require confirmation of contacts. This confirmation is usually in the form of a QSL card



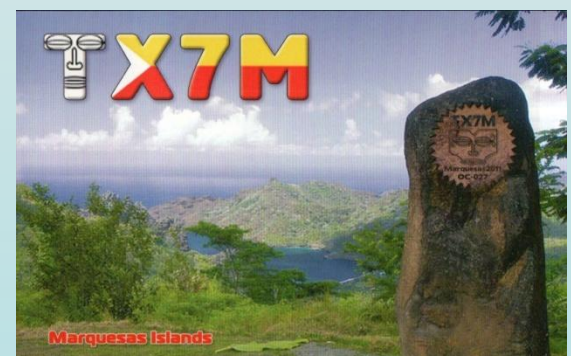
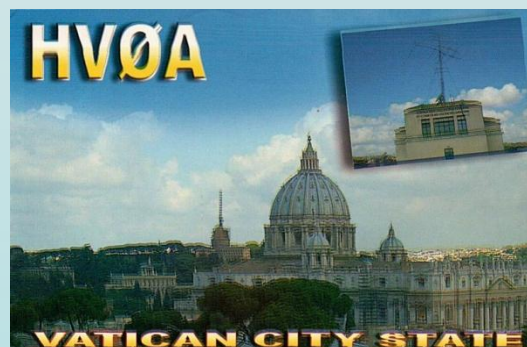
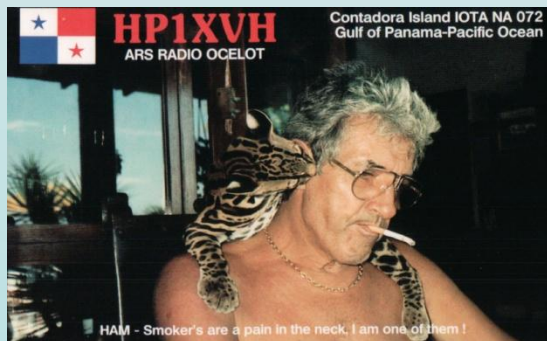
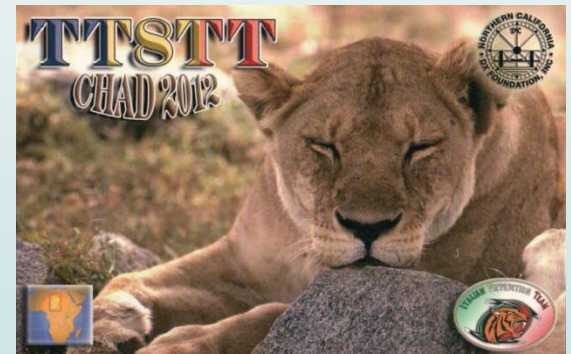
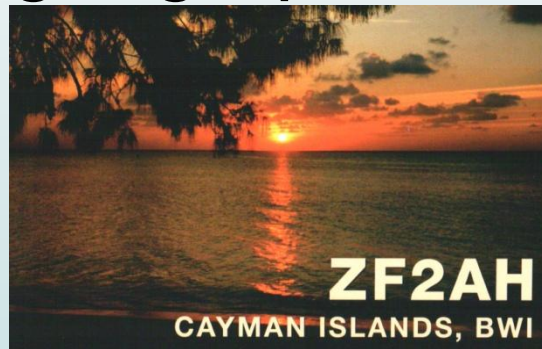

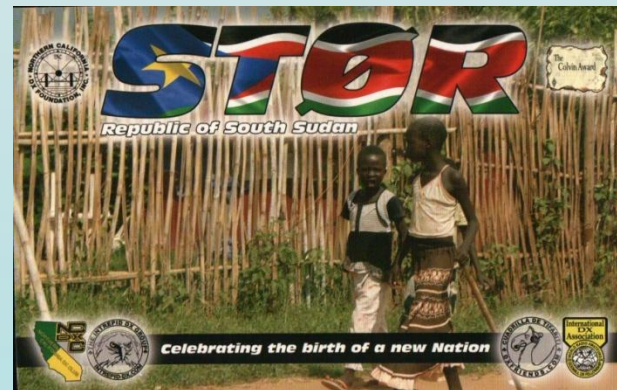
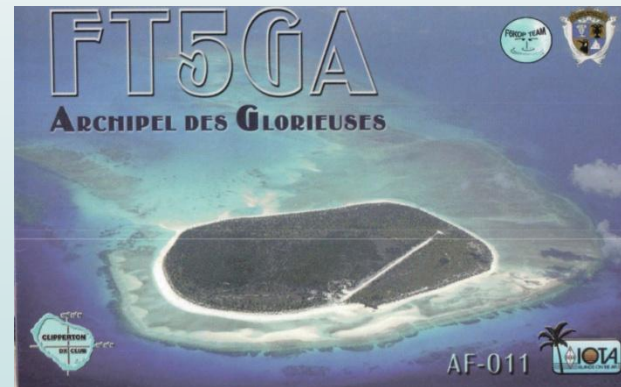
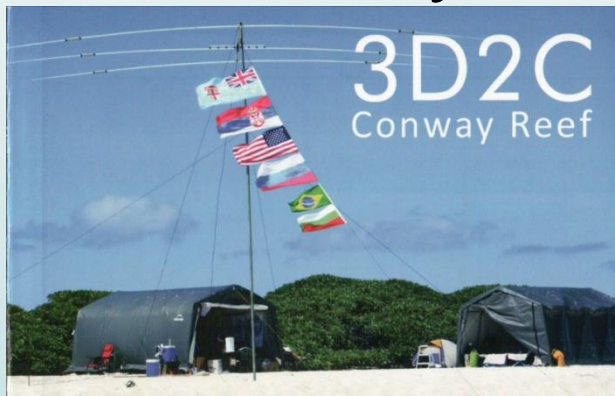
Why QSL cards?

QSL Methods

- Direct
- Bureau
- e-QSL
- LoTW
- OQRS (DXpeditions)

(LoTW has been presented & e-QSL is similar.
These methods are not covered in this presentation)

Pros and Cons

Method	Pro	Con
Direct	Fast	Can be expensive - Postage - Green Stamp - IRC
Bureau*	Cheap	Can take 3-4 years depending on activity
e-QSL	Fast	Not good for all awards - plus, you have no hard copy card
LoTW	Fast	Not good for all awards - plus, you have no hard copy card
DXped	Easy	Costs about \$5 and usually arrive within a month or two

*** There are more bureau services out there, but this presentation only refers to the ARRL Bureau.**

So why use the different methods?

- **Direct**

Need that card! The DX station **may have a stateside QSL manager** which saves \$\$

Pay attention to details - Green Stamp, SASE, SAE? Some countries **forbid** US dollars

Check QRZ.com or Hamnet.com
details may be listed there

- Bureau - Okay, I want the card, but I'm not in a hurry
- e-QSL - I'm going for a e-QSL award and don't want to mess with postage and physical cards
- Drawbacks to e-QSL and LoTW. The ham you contacted must also be on those systems, or no confirmation of contact is made

- DXpeditions - New trend over the past few years. DXpeditions have on-line logs, so you can verify that they have you in the log. However - the details are missing (other than the band or

mode). So you have to fill out a request and send in a \$5 donation (usually PayPal). They will compare your log entry to theirs and send you the card (postage paid).
Real easy!



What is OQRS?

- OQRS = Online QSL Request System
- Request your ZL8X QSL card(s) online without sending your card to us!
- The QSO data you are entering will be checked by our QSL manager (in case of typos or time shifts)!
- Save money and time!

Bureau QSL

Enter following information:

- Your callsign
- Your e-mail address
- The data of your QSOs with ZL8X

You will receive your ZL8X QSL card(s) via the bureau.

Direct QSL

Enter following information:

- Your Callsign
- Your e-mail address
- The data of your QSOs with ZL8X

In combination with a minimum donation of US-\$ 5,- or EUR 3,- your ZL8X QSL card(s) will be sent directly to your address.

GENERAL QSL BUREAU INFO

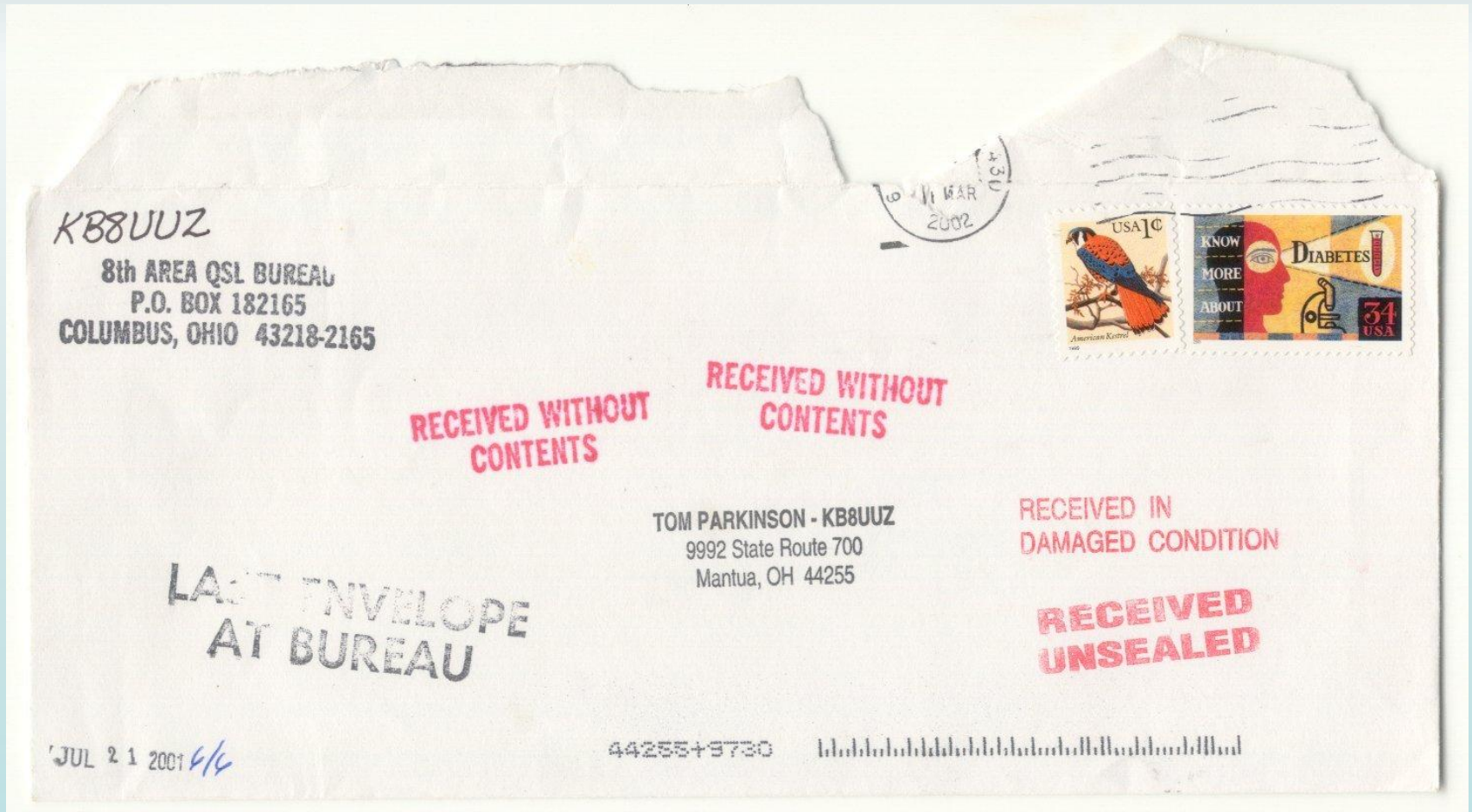
- The 8th call area bureau operates as part of the ARRL's volunteer QSL bureau system
- The 8th district central bureau is located at the Voice of America Museum in West Chester where it is one of the permanent displays

KEEP ENVELOPES ON FILE WITH THE BUREAU

- Send NON-clasp-fastening, end-opening envelopes, between 5x7 and 6x9 inches in size. Unless you receive lots and lots of bureau cards DO NOT send more than 3 or 4 (self addressed stamped envelopes) SASE at a time. DO NOT use envelopes smaller or larger than 5x7 or 6x9

- Make sure to include your **EMAIL** address when you send SASEs to the bureau or your Manager. If your **EMAIL** address changes, make sure you notify your Manager of the change
- **DO NOT SEND USED ENVELOPES** to the bureau. The bureau will ***NOT*** attempt to use used envelopes

- Don't use Self Seal envelopes:



- When you prepare envelope, **NEATLY** print your call, in **BLOCK LETTERS** , in the upper left corner, in the place where a normal return address goes
- If they can't read your call or the postman can't read your address, you won't get them. If you have a change of address, send us address labels to cover your old address

- When sending envelopes with stamps, affix enough postage to cover at least one ounce of weight. Currently, the post office is selling a "**forever**" stamp good for one unit of postage. Use 2 stamps per envelope.



ARRL Outgoing QSL Bureau

- Enclose proof of your current ARRL membership. This can be in the form of a photocopy or cut-out of the address area from your current copy of **QST**. You can also write the information from the label on a slip of paper and use that as proof of membership. A copy of your current membership card is also acceptable.
